

What Does the Cross Mean to You?

The Martin Tower is a 21 story building on 8th Ave in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania. It was built in 1969 to house the headquarters for the Bethlehem Steel Company. It is an impressive building that was placed on the National Register of Historic Places in 2010. But what makes it truly unique is its shape. The building, you see, is shaped like a cross.

I first heard about the building while listening to the radio. Commentators were noting its unique design, and as a pastor I was almost giddy. A cross-shaped building! Does it get any cooler than that? But then the other shoe dropped. Turns out they only chose a cross shape so that there would be more corner offices to appease the company's managers and those at the top. That's a little different use of the cross than I was expecting.

As we enter the season of Lent, let me pose a question. What does the cross mean to you?

For Bethlehem Steel the cross shape meant honor and privilege. It meant twice as many corner offices. Twice as much prestige. Two times as many happy CEOs. But the cross, in its essence, isn't about self-promotion it's about sacrifice. The cross isn't a place of honor, but humiliation. The cross doesn't represent power, but obedience even to death.

Just decades after the Martin Tower was completed the building stood vacant. The cross-shaped, 21-story sky scraper which stood as the tallest building in the area and as a sign of Bethlehem's power and success, now reads more like an oversized tombstone. The building was a sign of their vitality, yet points to their death.



I compare that to the cross of Christ. A symbol of death and Roman dominance. Yet, a symbol of hope and life for Christians for thousands of years. Bethlehem hoped the cross would lead to life, and found death. Jesus's cross was meant for death, yet leads us to life.

We'll start Lent off by placing ashes on our forehead in the shape of the cross. I'm going to invite our children (and you) to make signs of the cross before receiving communion during the children's sermon. But what will that cross mean? Will it mean what it did for Bethlehem Steel? Or what it meant for Jesus?

Which will reign in your life this lent? Self-giving or self-promotion? Humility or prestige? Sacrifice or personal achievement? We know which the world would have us choose, but we also know where that would lead us. Too often our pursuit of life leads to death. Let us focus instead on our own sacrifice and surrender. There we will find life.
