Although Carol and I have a strict no pet policy at our house at the moment, that shouldn't suggest we do not share our house with other living things (and I'm not simply referring to our children). Carol is addicted to plants. Currently there are over 40 houseplants under our roof, and that number is always growing. The really funny part to me is that she likes plants so much she's dedicated an entire photo album to them on her Facebook.

Having that many plants, I've come to realize, is a dance. It involves almost as much tinkering day to day as a retiree and his lawn. There's watering, of course, but there's also rotating, trimming, & sweetly singing them to sleep (where's my lullaby?!). But of all the things I've seen her do, the other day I caught her doing the last thing I'd expect. She took nearly a quarter of the plants out of their spots to the garage gardening station and proceeded to replant each into a different pot. Confused I asked her what was going on, and she nonchalantly responded, "No biggie. Just don't want these little guys to get root bound."

Root bound. Apparently if a plant grows large enough in a contained pot the roots can run out of room to grow. Consequently, the plant's growth isn't simply stunted, but the plant begins to wilt and in some cases even starts to die.


And nobody wants that. Not with our plants. Not with our lives. Not with our church.

Last month after weeks of conversation, months of meetings and research, and years of carefully listening for God's voice, our congregation made two historic votes. First, we voted to increase our staff. And second, we voted to build. In both cases we were acknowledging that we are dangerously close to being root bound. We have run out of space for the ministry God is calling us to, and I have run out of time (not an easy thing for me to admit). So before our growth is stunted, or worse our ministries begin to wilt, we are replanting ourselves in a structure and building that we believe will allow us to continue growing into the church God is calling us to be.

### **A Note About Summer Giving:**

*As you can seem from our weekly giving, Hope's 2016 is off to a healthy start through the first half of 2016. As is our pattern, however, beginning in June we see a slight dip in offering. With each week's offering down \$400-500 on average, that makes our monthly income short thousands of dollars throughout the summer months. We certainly recognize that summer comes with busy schedules, but simply ask those who can to please remember Hope. Our summer ministries are vibrant and alive, and we cannot thank you enough for your continued support in making them happen.*

It can be too easy as individuals and as churches to get stuck in patterns and settings that stifle our growth and limit our potential rather than free us to grow into the people God wants us to be. And it can be difficult to change from those patterns and settings, because in most cases those patterns and settings served us well for a long time. They were how we grew in the first place, so changing (or even thinking about changing) can prove difficult. But we must remember that the only reason we are saying goodbye to what gave us life, is to welcome what will give us life into the future.

I left the meeting a few weeks ago proud of our congregation, and you must believe me when I say no one is more keenly aware of the cost or consequences of our decision than I am. But I am proud because I remain equally aware of the cost of keeping everything the same—both for Hope's pastors and for our congregation. We'd be root bound, because God is not done adding to our life together, but we have run out of room and time.

As we grow into this new vision of Hope Lutheran Church, please allow me to solicit your prayers. I need them. Chris and the rest of our staff needs them. Our council and committees need them. And we are sending them back to God for you. And at last, let me leave you with this reminder from the Apostle Paul. Paul once told the church in Corinth, "I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the growth." (1 Cor. 3:6). God gives the growth, but we participate. May we always have ears to hear where God is calling us to go, eyes to see the way, and, most importantly, courage to follow.



## A Future With Hope—UPDATE

On Sunday, June 26 a congregational meeting was held immediately following worship. Pastor Hannon opened the meeting in prayer and Council President Bob Vossler introduced the motions. Mr. Vossler reminded those present that while this may be a first for many of us as individuals, this was not the first time our congregation has gathered to discern the future of Hope. Each motion was introduced, followed by a period of questions and answers before calling the vote. Each motion passed.

### Motion #1: Parking Lot

*(Unanimous Approval)*

Motion to fundraise and spend \$39,000 plus incidental costs up to an additional \$10,000 all outside the regular operating budget on a capital improvement to our parking lot that includes widening our west entrance, adding 10' along the west edge of the lot, and top coating the entire surface.

### Motion #2: Expanding Chris LiPuma's Role and Responsibility

*(Unanimous Approval, 1 Abstention)*

Motion to expand Chris LiPuma's current position to a  $\frac{3}{4}$  time salaried position at \$22,000/year with a one year contract beginning in September 2016 and ending in August 2017 with the option to renew. Chris' responsibilities will include planning and overseeing all ministries related to congregational life as well as assisting Pastor Shawn with our pastoral ministry.

### Motion #3: A Future With Hope

*(Unanimous Approval, 3 Abstentions)*

Motion to begin the process of planning and fundraising for a 10,384 square foot addition to the east of our existing social hall. The new building will serve as a Community Center, and include space to run and play, gather and eat, learn and grow, reach out to our neighbors in need, and more. A capital campaign will begin in September 2016 with a goal of raising \$350,000 internally and asking our community and grant sources/foundations/businesses to help us achieve our fundraising goal of \$1,100,000. If a difference must be made up via a loan, another congregational vote will be called.

Naturally, each motion will require our congregation to get to work to make them a reality. A financial committee is beginning the process of planning the campaign for the new building. Our building and grounds committee is finalizing the details for the parking lot. And Chris is beginning to plan his transition into his new responsibilities here at Hope. We hope to keep the conversation open to the Holy Spirit and the process as transparent as possible. Please let either Pastor or Mr. Vossler know if you have any questions or comments.

## From Mr. Chris Youth Director

This morning as I awoke to my alarm clock blasting off in my ear I did my usual routine, . I rolled over, struggled to find my phone and in a sleep fog started to scroll through Facebook and every other social media I am a part of. The benefit of going to bed early is you feel fantastic in the morning, but as I saw the posts of many of my friends it became clear that I had missed something huge. Everyone kept posting about the horror that has happened this past week with the deaths of two African American men at the hands of the police seeming to all come to head with the police that were attacked in Dallas this morning. I tried to catch up the best I could, mind you I was still half asleep at this point, my mind trying to comprehend all of this senseless loss of life. I tried to find a news story of the events but realized my friends statuses were all the information I needed. It seems that anything that happens in the news today I have friends who are experts in police brutality, second amendment rights, tranquilizer darts and gorillas and alligators in Disney. It seems we have become just a reactionary society. It may just be me but it seems that our 24 hour news coverage and social media has become the only things we talk about. Instead of enjoying being with family and friends on the 4th of July, I'm having a debate on guns, gorillas and alligators. A time where I am supposed to just enjoy has turned into a time I can prove my point. Is that what life has become for me? An endless debate about the latest news stories in the media?

As I read my newsfeed this morning I scrolled through posts about how the police were in the right and how the police were in the wrong. I read posts about how are country is falling apart and how we are doomed. But as I kept scrolling posts about love and hope started to pop up. People sharing Martin Luther Kings quote about light getting rid of darkness. Debates about all the other stuff was starting to disappear and love and hope posts were taking over. On a side note Pastor Shawn, Paul and I went to a concert the other night in Canandaigua. The music was fantastic and we had an amazing time. But as I sat in the crowd of thousands I kept having this same thought. People just want to be loved and matter. As we sang and danced the night away there was no thoughts of death and violence, not what the latest story on the news was. We were just surrounded by love and happiness. It made me think that this country is not doomed, were not falling apart. I think for the most part there is a ton of good going on and that night I felt that.

Pastor Shawn preached that the only way to drive out the darkness is with Jesus and he's right. Love is the only thing that can conquer the ending debates and "problems" we seem to be facing. But how? Its easy to post about love but are we acting in that love? WE come to church each Sunday to hear the word but are we acting on it? I look at myself, how great it is to be a part of a loving community such as Hope but am I spreading that love? Are we doing all that we can? I think we can do more, whether its just a smile to a stranger, a phone call to a relative you haven't spoken with, or just putting down our phones and having a conversation with each other. Lets not focus on how things are feeling messed up. Lets put that thought and energy into action, lets act on love, act on Jesus.


## Confirmation






