

## Meeting the New While Recognizing the Past

A Reflection from Pastor Shawn

In case you haven't noticed, there is a bit of a building project going on at Hope. The construction of the Future with Hope Community and Ministry Center is underway. So far we have completed the site work, poured the foundation, built the walls, and put the plywood sheeting on the exterior of the building. As we prepare for the trusses and the roof, the Hope building crew is tackling the next step on our to-do list: We are tying the new building into the existing one.

Tying the new building into the existing one is an exciting process that must be done carefully. Unlike the past phases of construction where we were working with empty land and new materials, suddenly we are forced to slow down and consider how what we are doing works with what is already here. While it might be nice to power through and simply throw up a new wall, the past bids us to stop and listen. Ignoring the call would result in many disasters.

As we analyzed the connection between the old and new buildings for wires, roof pitches, water runoff, and more, I found myself asking questions about more than simply the infrastructure. We are tying into the old nursery room. How many children have played in that room? It will become a hallway to our existing fellowship hall. How many of the faithful have gathered there for conversation before or after worship, ate a church meal there with their friends, or used the space to celebrate a significant milestone in their faith journey like a baptism, communion, or wedding? And more, who built those walls like we were building the new ones? What would they think about their wall becoming a doorway?

Honor its blessings. Learn its lessons. It has made you who you are, and it may not be quite done forming you just yet.
