### "Redeemed"

#### A Reflection from Pastor Shawn

After his win at the Zozo Championship in late October, Tiger Woods is now the winningest golfer in history. With his 82nd win, Tiger joins Sam Snead on the top of the list. If you do not follow golf as closely as I do, that may not even seem like news. Tiger was anointed in 1997, and for over a decade it seemed like he was going to win every tournament he played. There would not be a record left unbroken. But while his rise to the top was glorious and long, in a moment his hopes (our hopes) shattered like a literal rear view window.

He seemed super human. His poise unparalleled. He was set to stand alone as the greatest golfer of all time. And then his world came crashing down. The first thing to catch up to him was his sin. It always does. He (and we) realized he was human, and his body proved it again. Injuries led to surgeries. Surgeries led to recovery. And for a long time it appeared as if Tiger Wood's career as a professional golfer was finished.

I came of age in the Tiger Wood's era. When he won his first major (the Masters) in 1997 I was 12 years old. When he won the last of his original 14 majors in 2008 I watched in the apartment my new wife, Carol, and I moved into 2 weeks before. I've seen some amazing Tiger moments. And I've seen some disappointing ones. And I mention all of that to say this: The best Tiger moments of his career have been the recent ones; not despite his fall and his struggles but because of them.


We used to think Tiger was more machine than man. We learned otherwise. The Tiger we watch now is not just a hot shot with natural ability, but a dedicated worker who chooses to grind rather than give up. He was humbled, embarrassed, and exposed, but rather than run from his shame, he started a new chapter with accountability. Every report is that he treats his fellow golfers differently. He's warmer. He's one of the guys.

Since his return, Tiger has won 3 times including another major, and as I said above, he is now the winningest golfer in history. But regardless of whether he catches Jack's record for majors, let the record clearly state he is already the greatest of all time. Not because of his flawless swing, but because of the ways he has navigated the unavoidable flaws in life.

Our worst moments do not get to define us, and there is no broken moment in our life that God cannot redeem. Peter lead the new church after he denied Christ three times. Paul built up Christian communities throughout the region after he brutally and systematically murdered practicing Christians. David led Israel after his assault of Bethsheba and murder of her husband. Rahab helped the Israelites after her days as a prostitute. Abraham fathered a nation after his distrust in the promise. The list goes on and on.

And this is particularly important for us to hear in light of today's obsession with one another's faults. The truth is we are all human, even Tiger Woods, and it is not a matter of whether we will fall, but when. And since our falls do not get the last laugh with our God of redemption, than we must not let them get the last laugh with us. True greatness is not merely accumulated in the win column, but in what we make of the losses. God is never done writing any of our stories.




#### **November 12: Get Air Trip**






