### A Shoot Shall Rise

#### A Reflection from Pastor Shawn

We recently cut down a couple of ash trees at Hope to make room for the Community and Ministry Center we plan to build over the next 18 months. We left the stumps a bit higher than you might expect so that a bull dozer can help take them out. Perhaps that's why I noticed.

Initially the stumps were just as you'd expect. Bare bark leading up to a sawed off top. But as the weeks passed something began to happen. Although the stumps were destined for the dozer, apparently, they didn't get the message. At first a shoot shot off the side of each of the stumps, and if you look at them



today it looks like they each have a bush growing directly where the rest of the tree used to be.

It's no secret I love this image, and I was delighted to see it spring to life at Hope. The prophet Isaiah wrote, "A shoot shall rise from the stump of Jesse" (Is. 11:1). What a message of hope.

Isaiah was talking to the kingdom of Israel. They had experienced greatness. They inherited a promised land and God established them as a kingdom. But through the course of history they were conquered, this time by Assyria. They were cut down. The end. Or so they thought.

Even when we feel like a stump, God's plan is always to spring up newness of life in us. In short, God turns all the times we want to say shoot into shoots of life.



# A FUTURE WITH HOPE

The batter boards are up, the trees are down, the driveway is history, and the playground is moved. Things are moving and shaking on Hope's east lawn in preparation for the building of the Future With Hope Community and Ministry Center over the next 18 months.

<u>Construction Update:</u> All of our paperwork is in the town and county hands, as we wait for the permit to build. We have extensive plans from our architect and engineer. Once we have our permit and the proverbial green light on our building plan we will finalize our material list. From



there we will be looking for community partners and the best prices for the highest quality of work. If you or anyone you know of is interested in partnering with us on the building side, please speak with Pastor Shawn.

<u>Financial Update:</u> Gifts for the Future with Hope Community and Ministry Center continue to come in. To date in 2018 we have received over \$30K in new donations with \$75K in pledges outstanding through the end of the year. We are approximately 2/3 of the way to our cash goal of \$700,000.

Overall, the Future with Hope campaign is doing great, and we thank God for his faithfulness. We have been blessed as a congregation and we are living into that blessing, paving the way for an incredible future. And God is doing that through YOU-no endowments, no grants, no tax dollars... just your faithful giving. It truly is amazing what we are capable of when we come together. ## **Synod Notes**

#### A Reflection on the 31st Assembly of the Upstate NY Synod in June.

I would like to thank Hope Lutheran Church for giving me the opportunity to attend and be a voting member at the 31st Assembly of the Upstate New York Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America on June 3-5 in Rochester, NY. Interesting facts

- There are 167 congregations in the Upstate New York Synod
- The synod has 52,553 baptized members
- The ELCA has 9 regions and the Upstate New York Synod is located in Region 7
- The annual budget for 2017-2018 is \$1,236,900
- 43.2% of the pastors rostered in our synod are retired
- Bishops are elected to a 6 year term
- There are 65 synods in the ELCA
- There are 9,329 congregations in the ELCA
- The ELCA supports 26 colleges and universities and 7 seminaries
- The Upstate New York Synod has 5 campus ministries
- The Lutheran Services in American is one of the largest health and human services networks in the country

At the convention there were worship services, election of officers and committee members, voting on various resolutions and budgets brought before those in attendance, various workshops, mission expos and fellowship.

While some of the reports were rather lengthy and to be honest a little boring, it was also enlightening to see everything that is going on in our synod and the church at large.

As I am the Financial Secretary here at Hope, I attended a workshop on Finance 101. This workshop focused on the responsibilities as Council members and most importantly as fiduciaries of our church. The primary duties of the Council members include 'duty of care' to act in good faith; 'duty of loyalty' to act in the interest of the congregation, avoiding conflicts of interest; and 'duty of obedience' to insure that the congregation



complies with appropriate laws and regulations. I also attended a workshop on Beyond the Screen: Back to the Light which focused upon the current environment surrounding our Church's young people and the importance of their participation in the Lutheran Outdoor Ministries. Basically putting down the electronics and getting out into nature.

I would say that the highlight of the convention was a lively discussion one evening with several pastors and the Keynote Speaker of the Assembly Pastor Ruben Duran, ELCA Director for Congregational Vitality.


